- 2) To make the environment clean


#### Highlights of the program:-







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


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### Nurture the Future-Empower the Adolescent Girls



  crazy to soft drinks, chocolates and junk food.


 They should be advised to play out door games and regular physical exercise like cycling, skipping, jogging, running and swimming etc.









Fig1. Picture from "Women's Safety" book

The event was started with the indroduction of team members byDr. Kamal Deep Peter. The first talk on cloud computing was given by Hemant Bansal.


# Topics name: Cloud - Models, Technologies and Learning Resources

The session informed students on how to kick -start their cloud careers with knowledge, relevant training and certifications in the field and boost their employability chances.



In today's context, wall paintings serve different purposes. Not only do they bring art into a public space, the artists also receive more recognition. Graffiti – a type of wall painting has often been created against the law, however, now due to their particular style and popularity they are commissioned by pubs, bars and restaurants.

Today people can be found commissioning such murals to express their personal choices and individuality. This feature has increased commissioned work amongst artists across the world. Incorporating certain messages and elements according to the theme, hand painted murals serve different purposes for hospitals, corporate offices and schools.

Many people like to express their individuality by commissioning an artist to paint a muralin their home. This is not an activity exclusively for owners of large houses. A mural artistis only limited by the fee and therefore the time spent on the painting; dictating the level of detail; a simple mural can be added to the smallest of walls.

# Chapter 2 IDEA FOR WALL PAINTING



Swachh Bharat Mission (SBM), Swachh Bharat Abhiyan, or Clean India Mission is a country-wide campaign initiated by the Government of India in 2014 to eliminate open defecation and improve solid waste management. It is a restructured version of the NirmalBharat Abhiyan launched in 2009 that failed to achieve its intended targets.

Phase 1 of the Swachh Bharat Mission lasted till October 2019.

Phase 2 is being implemented between 2020–21 and 2024–25 to help cement the work of Phase 1. Initiated by the Government of India, the mission aimed to achieve an "open-defecation free" (ODF) India by 2 October 2019, the 150th anniversary of the birth of Mahatma Gandhi through construction of toilets. An estimated 89.9 million toilets werebuilt in the period. The objectives of the first phase of the mission also includederadication of manual scavenging, generating awareness and bringing about a behaviour change regarding sanitation practices, and augmentation of capacity at the local level.

# INDEPENDENCE DAY: 15/8/2018

The struggle for India's Independence began in 1857 with the Sepoy Mutiny in Meerut. Later, in the 20th century, the Indian National Congress and other political organizations, under the leadership of Mahatma Gandhi, launched a countrywide independence movement. Colonial powers were transferred to India on August 15, 1947.

The Constituent Assembly, to who power was to be transferred, met to celebrate India's independence at 11pm on August 14, 1947. India gained its liberty and became a free country at midnight between August 14 and August 15, 1947. It was then that the free India's first prime minister Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru gave his famous "Tryst with Destiny" speech. People across India are reminded of the meaning of this event - that it marked the start of a new era of deliverance from the British colonialism that took place in India for more than 200 years.

Independence Day is a day when people in India pay homage to their leaders and those who fought for India's freedom in the past. The period leading up to Independence Day is a time when major government buildings are illuminated with strings of lights and the tricolor flutters from homes and other buildings. Broadcast, print and online media may have special contests, programs, and articles to promote the day. Movies about India's freedom fighters are also shown on television.
